Aims and activities of the organisation	<p>CdFD is a small Romanian NGO working with documentary photography (which may stretch from photojournalism to art) in interdisciplinary team (photographers, writers, designers, coders, researchers, musicians).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • we provide photography grants; • have launched the first printed collection of documentary photography in Romania; • developed a free online digital archive of the most important visual projects done recently in Romania. <p>The results of our work are typically photo exhibitions, books, or experimental publications, such as zines or postcard sets</p> <p>In 2024, our latest project – Pride and Concrete. 10 years Later - was nominated for the European Press Prize / The Migration Journalism Award 2024 and we've also published the book of the project.</p> <p>After the pandemic experience, we are slowly shifting our classic photo exhibitions into multimedia projections/websites which are more flexible, easier to travel with and reach new audiences. We</p>

usually wrap up our projects in a multimedia projection with an original soundtrack by Electric Brother (a well-known musician in Romania) based on the sounds recorded during field research.

We aim to tour multimedia photo projections, photo books, and experimental editorial print pop-up exhibitions across Europe, all based on CdFD's interdisciplinary, long-term visual documentary projects. These projects, spanning over a decade, will be accompanied by an original music soundtrack by Electric Brother based on a audio archive collected during field research.

The activities include screenings of long-term documentary photography projects (10+ years) (we have our own set-up of a pop-up cinema), engaging debates, and mentorship programs for emerging creators. By this, we seek to promote documentary photography as a powerful tool for intercultural communication, stimulate meaningful dialogue, and expand audiences for contemporary visual arts.

We have organized grant competitions in Romania for documentary photography projects and secured funding for cultural initiatives, including support from **Administration of the National Cultural Fund in Romania (AFCN)** since 2016.

Furthermore, we have successfully collaborated with esteemed organizations such as the **Romanian Cultural Institute (ICR)**, the **Order of Architects of Romania (OAR)**, the **Center for Cultural Projects of the Municipality of Bucharest (ARCUB)**, the **German Marshall Fund**, **World Press Photo**, the **Robert Bosch Foundation**, and **Journalismfund.eu**
